Introduction and Background

Playing Objective of the Beginner's Game

Object of the Game is to score more goals than your competitor within a defined timeframe i.e. a time you agree before starting – between 20 minutes to 40 minutes (or longer if you wish).

NOTE : Basketball Chess is played on a Chess Board with opposing Teams at opposite ends.

Playing the Beginner's Game

Introduction to Playing the Game

The following explanation tells you how to set-up the board and arrange basic moves for the "Play at Home" version of Basketball Chess involving two players/teams.

Objective of the Game

The objective of the game is to score more goals than the opposition within a given time period.

Step 1: Building Your Team

Each Player builds his/her Team using the following guidelines.

Place your players on the board as you would for normal chess.

Step 2: Playing the Game

The idea is to move your ball – pawns – down the board to score a goal by getting them to the opposite end of the board.

Each pawn that reaches the opposite end is a "goal" only if it is on a square that one of your players can move to i.e. it must be on a square that either your Centre, Power Forward, Small Forward, Point Guard, or Shooting Guard can move to if it were not for the fact that your ball (pawn) is on the square. A pawn can be at the end of the board but must not be called a goal until the square it is on becomes a square onto which one of your pieces can move. When this happens, it becomes a 2 point goal.

If a piece is two moves away from the square onto which your ball (pawn) has moved, then this ball scores a 3 point goal.

Once a ball (pawn) has scored a goal, it is then moved to any position on the fourth row from the end of the board closest to that team's starting position. If there are no places on this row, the ball is moved to any position on the third row.

Opposition Team players, and balls, can be taken in the same way as for ordinary Chess. Taking a piece means that player has been "taken out of the game" by a superior player or team.

Winning the Game

A player wins when she/he has the most goals in the time period or when he/she has the most goals and the opposition team has no more balls (pawns) with which to score goals.

Name of Piece	Movement
Centre	Same as for King in normal Chess
Power Forward	Same as for Queen in normal Chess
Point Guard	Same as for Bishop in normal Chess
Shooting Guard	Same as for Knight in normal Chess
Small Forward	Same as for Rooks in normal Chess
Ball	Same as for Pawns in normal Chess
